Excerpt from the sermon, “The Fountain of Life”...

Has Christ perfected and completely finished all his work for us? How sweet a relief is this to us that believe in him against all the defects and imperfections of all the works of God that are wrought by us. There is nothing, finished that we do: all our duties are imperfect duties; they come off lamely and defectively from our hands. It is Christ's charge against the church of Sardis, Rev. 3:2. I have not found your works "pepleromena" perfect, or filled up before God. O there is much impudence and vanity in the best of our duties: but here is the grand relief, and that which answers to all the grounds of our doubts and fears upon that account; Jesus Christ has finished all his work, though we can finish none of ours: and so, though we be defective, poor, imperfect creatures, in ourselves, yet, notwithstanding, we are complete in him, Col. 2:9, 10. Though we cannot perfectly obey, or fulfill one command of the law, yet is "the righteousness of the law fulfilled in us that believe," Rom. 8:4. Christ's complete obedience being imputed to us, makes us complete, and without fault before God.
