During this special service we will learn about the life of these two hymn writers, who lived in the 1700's, and what led them to write great hymns of the faith, such as Amazing Grace & There Is A Fountain.

Because He loved us — He "washed us from our sins in His own blood."

Even now, let praise for *redeeming love* rise from our hearts. And oh, may our voices join hereafter in saying, "Blessing, and honor, and glory, and power, be unto Him who sits upon the throne, and unto the Lamb forever and ever!" (Revelation 5:13).
