John MacArthur on today's text, Jude, Verses 8-16...

"If you're going to live an immoral life, you're going to have to find a false doctrine to save your conscience. And so, inevitably those people who are apostate are immoral and insubordinate to the Word of God because the two go together, right? Because immorality is disobedience. So the lie that Jesus is not Lord is a comfortable lie for immoral people who reject biblical authority and want to feel better about their sin. And, of course, that fits the modern liberals and fits the phony-baloney preachers who live immoral lies. It also bothers me, and this is just a footnote, that fewer people today would say that they don't believe Jesus has to be Lord, they don't believe in lordship salvation. People say, 'Oh yes, He's Lord, but pragmatic, seeker-friendly survey market-driven churches live as if He's not the Lord of that church because they replaced the truth of Scripture with the wisdom of men.'"
