The Pursuing Love of God - Psalm 23:6

Hear the word of God found in Psalm 23:6...

Surely goodness and mercy shall follow me all the days of my life, and I shall dwell in the house of the LORD forever.

Psalm 23 has given countless numbers comfort and encouragement. It consistently speaks solace and care to the troubled soul. But could it be saying more than we expect? Verse 6 reads, "Surely goodness and mercy will follow me all the days of my life." The Hebrew word for "follow" in this verse is the same word used for a pursuing army. Therefore, the verse could be translated "surely goodness and love pursue me." Or possibly, "surely goodness and love track me down."

Who pursues us like no human lover ever would? Who would go to the ends of the earth to draw us to Himself? Who looks for us and seeks us out to no end? Who has released the hounds of heaven to retrieve us? Who will never leave, nor forsake us? God is Who.

We might think that we have chosen God, but scripture indicates that God has been lovingly and patiently pursuing us all of our lives. Those who are Christians or may someday become Christians, are being continually pursued as a lost love does their soul mate. The pursuit is relentless, it is effectual, it is with great intensity that God the Father seeks those to whom will be His children for now and for eternity. And God never gives up this pursuit.

Before we had anything to offer him, before we lifted our voices in praise or our hands to His work, before we opened a bible or walked into a church building, in fact even before we were ever created God was pursuing us with his love.

We don't deserve the Love of God. We are gossips and worriers, we are lazy and irritable, we are controlled by our lusts and our appetites. We search after everything but God and turn our backs on Him at every turn, and he still comes after us, chasing us, pursuing us with His unending love.

His love was announced by a baby in a manger. His love was proven by his body on a cross. In this time, in this place, let us dwell on that love. Let us put aside thoughts of trees and presents and malls and meals and focus on God's pursuing love.

He is pursuing you right now. He knows you, knows your thoughts, and your actions. He is close to you, dwelling with you, delighting in you, and he loves you. Today is one more time that he is reminding you of that love.

Today is one more time where God is reaching out to you and asking you to drink deep of Him and his love for you. No matter where you come from, no matter what is going on in your life, or who has let you down or abandoned you, God has sought you out, and brought you here to say, "I love you."

This advent season let us be reminded that God promised to send the Savior, and He faithfully fulfilled that promise. God is pursuing those who He has called to be His children. Is He pursuing you? Don't delay in responding to his call. "...Behold, now is the day of salvation." (2 Corinthians 6:2)
