Reasons to Proclaim the Good News of Jesus

Why should you as a believer witness? Consider these four biblical reasons:

- 1) Our knowledge makes us responsible (Romans 1:14-17)
- 2) Our blessings make us responsible (2 Kings 7:3-9)
- 3) The Great Commission makes us responsible (Matthew 28:18-20)
- 4) Our position in Christ makes us responsible (2 Corinthians 5:20)

If that were not enough, consider the four motivations the apostle Paul mentions in 2 Corinthians 5:

- 1) The judgment of each believer awaits (vs 10)
- 2) The terror of the Lord awaits (vs 11)
- 3) The constraining love of Christ should compel us (vs 14)
- 4) The costly work of Christ should spur us to live for Him rather than for ourselves (vs 15)
