O God Our Help in Ages Past

The Hymn of the Month for June is "O God Our Help in Ages Past." The text to this ancient hymn was written by Isaac Watts in 1714, shortly before the death of Queen Anne of England. This was a time of great crises and turmoil, as the successor of Queen Anne was as yet undetermined, and the fear of a monarch who would reinstate the persecution of Protestants was great. King George I prevented such persecution, but the fear before Anne's death was great. This was the context in which Watts wrote his powerful text, now lauded as "one of the grandest in the whole realm of English Hymnody" (Bailey, The Gospel in Hymns, 54).

Watts' text was published in The Psalms of David Imitated, 1719, in nine stanzas. Now, the original first, second, third, fifth, seventh, and ninth stanza are commonly sung. In 1738, John Wesley changed "Our God, our help" to "O God, our help" for Collection of Psalms and Hymns.
